Emergency Responses:

The Monmouth Fire Department utilizes fire reporting software approved by the United States Fire Administration and the Office of the Illinois State Fire Marshal. This software records fire department responses in over 90 categories to track fire department emergency response statistics. This information is used by the department to support decision-making for fire response planning. Tracking response data with approved software is also required for fire departments receiving Federal and State grant dollars.

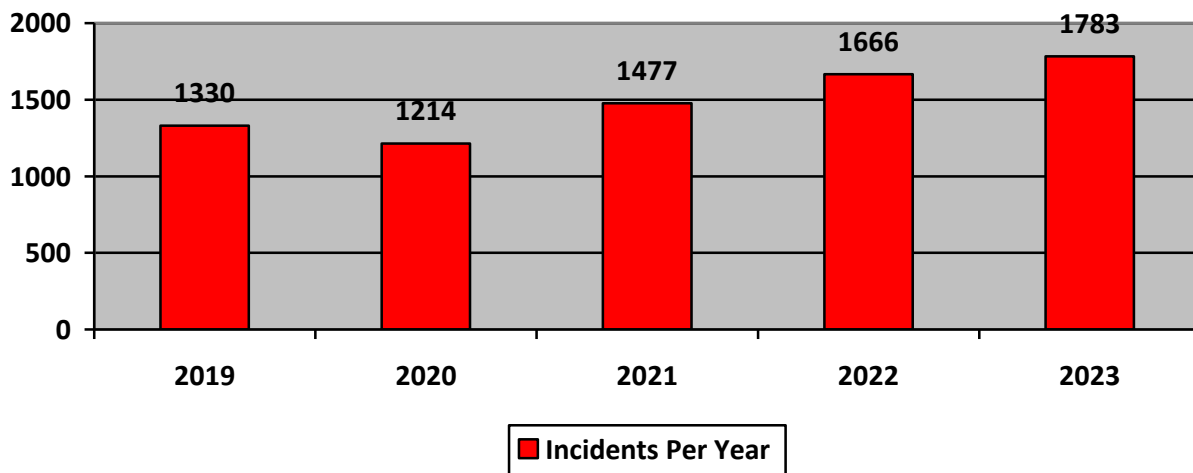

Staff Training:

During the month of December, the fire department staff completed 141 hours of training on various topics. The emergency medical training topics for the month included “The Human Body: Critical Systems” and “Basic Patient Assessment”.

Non-Emergency Activities:

MFD participated in the annual “Keep the Wreath Red” campaign to spread awareness about fire safety during the holiday season. At the beginning of each December, a wreath is hung outside at Station I decorated in all red lights. Each time a structure fire occurs in the month of December, a red light is changed to white. MFD is happy to report that there were no structure fires during the month of December and we were able to keep all of the lights red.

The Monmouth Firefighters Local 1702 participated in the Jamieson Community Center Jingle Bills program and helped to raise \$1,094.17 for the fund. The firefighters rang the bell at County Market for several days during December to help with the program.

Fire Code Items:

MFD provided a fire safety inspection at Legacy Estates and Chief Rexroat completed a walkthrough of the Stockdale Center at MC to check on the progress and any safety concerns.

Apparatus and Equipment Related Items:

Engine 21 had an issue with the siren not working. Mechanics from Alexis Fire Equipment completed the repair.
