INCIDENTS OF NOTE:

*52 Ordinance Violations were issued during the month of June during 56 hours of IDOT traffic grant patrols. The violations consisted mostly of seat belt violations, child restraint violations, speeding, and distracted driving or cell phone use violations. Seven criminal arrests were also made during the traffic grant patrols. *MPD conduct our testing to establish an eligibility list for police officer. 5 candidates showed for the testing with only 2 passing the physical agility test and written test.
