INCIDENTS OF NOTE:

*MPD officers attended court on 10 different criminal cases during the month of May

*Chief Switzer met with MR #238 Superintendent Ed Fletcher, MRHS Principal Jeff Ewing and representatives from Carl Sandburg College. This was a collaboration meeting to come up with a Criminal Justice Degree program that would start in high school and allow high school students to take dual credit courses from Carl Sandburg as a fast track to getting an Associates degree in Criminal Justice. The hope of this program is to get high school students interested in law enforcement, provide a degree shortly after graduation from high school and recruit candidates for our eligibility lists. Also this program would allow the students to get interested in becoming a dispatcher until they are 21 and can become a police officer.

*Chief Switzer gave a talk to TRIAD at the Strom Center. The talk was focused on identity theft and what seniors should be doing to keep their information safe.
