INCIDENTS OF NOTE:

- *The Police Department has begun the process of transitioning from Cintas over to maintaining cleaning supplies and toiletries at the Department level. This switch will result in a cost savings of approximately 50 percent monthly for the Department and City.
- *MPD officers are now allowed to grow facial hair. This is being done on a trial basis with the trial running for 90 days. Facial hair is becoming more acceptable socially and in the law enforcement profession. There are parameters set by operational directive that the officers will have to adhere to in order to grow facial hair. At the end of the 90 trial period a reassessment will take place to see if the officers will continue wearing facial hair.
- *The Thanksgiving Traffic campaign was conducted with 53 traffic tickets being issued and 5 drug arrests being made. A majority of the traffic tickets issued were City Ordinance violations.

- *Dispatchers Kelly Lant and Jayme Horner attended the Illinois Public Safety Telecommunicators Association Conference.
- *ALICE Training was conducted at PASS for teachers and staff.
