### EQUIPMENT RELATED ISSUES:

\*I would like to relay to the Council that the new Kenwood digital radio system for MPD has been installed, digital mobile radios have been installed in all MPD squad cars and the officers have been issued digital portable radios. We have been using the system for a week now and it is working great. The digital system is a tremendous improvement over the older analog system that MPD was using. This digital system greatly enhances our communications capability. Just with the portable radios alone, we are able to communicate as far South as Roseville, as far West as Kirkwood, as far North as the US 67/135 Y, and as far East as the Warren/Knox County line. The mobile radios in the squad cars extend the range even further with communications for MPD officers covering the entire County for the most part. There have been several "dead spots" that have been identified, but these spots are negligible to the officer's communication capabilities. This



system and capability came at zero cost to the City of Monmouth. I do want to thank Ross and Rick Beedle of GEM Electronics and Ken Helms for the amount of work that they have put into fielding this project.
